of older Americans, including 91% of Hispanic respondents, agree that the government should reimburse pharmacists for providing testing, vaccination and treatment for COVID-19 and other infectious diseases, such as flu and strep.



#### of older Americans agree that they want access to testing, vaccination, and treatment at the pharmacy during COVID-19 and future public health emergencies, including 57% of nonwhite respondents who strongly agreed with this sentiment, and 89% of Hispanic respondents in general agreement.



#### of older Americans

report concern at the prospect of lacking reliable access to testing, vaccination, or treatment from their local pharmacist during future public health emergencies, including 53% of non-white respondents and 56% of Hispanic respondents who felt very concerned by this prospect.

The survey was fielded to 1,009 adults aged 64 and older and was conducted by John Zogby Strategies, a leading national consumer and political survey company.
